

## LPRD Recommended Memorial Tree List



Limited availability and locations may apply.

**Dogwood (*Cornus florida*)**-Height of 15-20ft. A popular ornamental species native to Ohio that produces beautiful white flowers in the spring.

**Hawthorn (*Crataegus crus galli*)**-Height of 15-30ft. Native thornless ornamental species that showcases five petaled white flowers in late spring.

**Redbud (*Cercis canadensis*)**-Height of 20-25ft. Stunning rosy pink/purple flowers emerge in late March through early April, usually lasting a few weeks. It is very popular as a native ornamental tree due to the vibrant coloration and shape.

**Serviceberry (*Amelanchier arborea*)**-Height of 15-40ft. A favorite of birds, this tree produces purple berries that can also be enjoyed by people. Small white flowers appear in early spring.

**American Hornbeam (*Carpinus caroliniana*)**-Height of 20-50ft. Also known as musclewood, the bark of the hornbeam is very distinct and resembles muscle as the name suggests. This native tree flowers in late spring and displays an array of beautiful colors in the fall.

**Linden (*Tilia americana*)**-Height of 70-90ft. Also known as the American Basswood, this tree produces small off-white fragrant flowers in early summer. This native species is very important to bees that produce high quality honey from the nectar.

**Red Maple (*Acer rubrum*)**-Height of 50-80ft. This native Ohio tree species is known for the deep red foliage seen in the fall that stands out against light gray bark.

**Sugar Maple (*Acer saccharum*)**-Height of 70-100ft. This iconic species is known for the incredible fall colors it produces. Sugar maples are also widely recognized as being the primary source of maple syrup.

**Kentucky Coffeetree (*Gymnocladus dioicus*)**-Height of 70-80ft. Native Ohio species that produces delicate white flowers in late spring.

**Oak (several varieties)**- Height of 50-100ft. These large stately trees represent both strength and longevity. Oaks are widely recognized for their beauty in the fall.

**Tuliptree (*Liriodendron tulipifera*)**-Height of 80-120ft. Also known as yellow poplar, this native tree is known for its elegant tulip shaped flowers seen in May and June.
